Highlights of February 10, 2024 Congregation Council meeting:

- The Council meeting was held Saturday, February 10 immediately prior to the Council Retreat due to the regularly scheduled time conflicting with Shrove Tuesday.
- The January 2024 offerings totaled \$38,398 which was \$18,268 more than our January expenses.
- We have two youth interested in attending the National Youth Gathering July 16-20, 2024 in New Orleans.
- There have been recent work activities in the North Wing Parking Lot. This is related to groundwater contamination from when the site was a Service Station and the underground gasoline tanks leaked. Two new wells were drilled on February 5. These new additional wells will be for the injection of air as part of the removal of the petroleum contamination. On Monday, February 12 through Friday, February 16 a tanker will be on-site to receive contaminated water vacuumed from two existing wells adjacent to the new wells. The lot will be closed for parking those days. The work is being performed by ACT of Charlotte through oversite and funding from the NC Department of Environmental Quality. The removal of the contaminants is an on-going process.
- The Special Easter Offering was designated by the Council to go to The Good Neighbor Shop. Donations can be made using the Special Easter Envelope or by using an envelope in the pew and writing The Good Neighbor Shop Special Easter offering on it.
- The Council approved an Agreement with the Lincolnton City Police authorizing the Police to act as Emmanuel's agent in ordering any individual to leave the premises during hours the church is closed. The Agreement is in response to vagrants congregating and/or sleeping on church grounds and the recent vandalism of church property at the Faith Building. This does not affect individuals that are in need from using our pantry during office hours. Distributions are made by Shelly.
- The Evangelism Committee, Pastor Judy and John Lineberger are exploring the printing of an updated pictorial directory of Emmanuel Members. This would be developed in-house.
- ◆ The Property Committee continues to address needed repairs to the church. Fellowship Hall walls were repaired. A portion of drain pipe for the sump that handles the ramp runoff was replaced due to a split in the pipe. The entire length was then insulated. Repairs and improvements were also made to prevent rain water from entering the Faith Building and soaking carpet. This occurred during the storms a few weeks ago.

Genesis 9:8-17

Today's reading is the conclusion to the flood story. Because of human sin, God destroys the earth by flood, saving only Noah, his family, and the animals on the ark. Yet divine destruction gives way to divine commitment. As in the first creation, God blesses humanity and establishes a covenant with all creatures.

⁸God said to Noah and to his sons with him, ⁹"As for me, I am establishing my covenant with you and your descendants after you, ¹⁰and with every living creature that is with you, the birds, the domestic animals, and every animal of the earth with you, as many as came out of the ark. ¹¹I establish my covenant with you, that never again shall all flesh be cut off by the waters of a flood, and never again shall there be a flood to destroy the earth." ¹²God said, "This is the sign of the covenant that I make between me and you and every living creature that is with you, for all future generations: ¹³I have set my bow in the clouds, and it shall be a sign of the covenant between me and the earth. ¹⁴When I bring clouds over the earth and the bow is seen in the clouds, ¹⁵I will remember my covenant that is between me and you and every living creature of all flesh; and the waters shall never again become a flood to destroy all flesh. ¹⁶When the bow is in the clouds, I will see it and remember the everlasting covenant between God and every living creature of all flesh that is on the earth." ¹⁷God said to Noah, "This is the sign of the covenant that I have established between me and all flesh that is on the earth."
