Highlights of July 12, 2022 Congregation Council meeting:

- Bob Lake was welcomed to Congregation Council. Bob is filling a vacant position on Council and will be chairing the Christian Education Committee. Bob is asking for your input and ideas on how to move forward with Christian Education activities and programs.
- Emmanuel will host a blood donation drive in the fellowship hall on Wednesday, October 12 from noon till 6:00 p.m. OneBlood (formerly Community Blood Center of the Carolinas) will be conducting the blood donation. It is open to the entire community.
- Our property insurance premium has increased significantly for this year (July 1, 2022 June 30, 2023) due to the insured cost of replacement for our buildings. This is a result of the spike in the cost of building materials and associated construction costs.
- Our June expenses exceeded our offerings by \$7,874. For the year our expenses have exceeded our offerings by \$16,056.
- The Columbarium and Memorial Garden Committee recommended a price increase from \$150 to \$175 for Memorial Plaques due to a price increase from the supplier and engraver. This was approved by the Council. It will not affect those who have prepaid.
- The Council will be exploring Bishop Tim Smith's challenge to have 70% of the NC congregations participate in the Be the Light Campaign, Welcome the Stranger through Lutheran Services Carolinas. This involves being actively engaged in the resettlement of refugees. Lutheran Services Carolinas is expected to be assisting around 750 refugees in NC and SC with probably 90% of them from Ukraine. We will be exploring in what capacity Emmanuel can partner in that effort. The Synod is conducting informational sessions in July and August.
- The Outreach Committee is scheduling a tea with members of Emmanuel and some other congregations to plan how to best minister and coordinate with Battleground Elementary School students, staff and teachers. Battleground is a school with a high percentage of students from lower income families. The tea is scheduled for July 27. Contact Julie Leonhardt for more information.



Share: Share your highs and lows

Read: Luke 10:38:42

Talk:

Slowly reflect on the reading. Did anything grab your attention as you read the passage? Stop for a second. Did you really read it slowly? Breathe. Read it again. Our lives are so busy and we are so easily distracted, aren't we? Even when there aren't things that demand our attention, we find things to take us away from the things that are important. This scene is played out so often in so many homes, offices, schools, etc. Some are trying to get all the work done, while others are sitting (figuratively) at the feet of the guest, the boss, the teacher, trying to absorb the meaningful morsels that emanate from them. It seems to be an issue of accomplishment vs relationship. And certainly both are important, but what does this story tell us about what is necessary?

We are all quick to judge the one who isn't pulling their weight, isn't contributing to the division of labor. How many times have you complained out loud or at least in your head, about someone that isn't doing their share of the work? But think about it this way. If you heard a knock on the door right now, and when you answered it, there stood Jesus, how would you greet him? Would you busy yourself with chores that were important, or would you bask in his presence? In awe and wonder, I know what I would be doing.

I think of this in relation to Sunday morning. God promises to meet us in worship, where the Word is preached, and where Jesus offer's us his body and blood for the forgiveness of our sins. God comes to dwell with us together as community, and invites us into that relationship. Yet, we are often too busy doing important things that we forget the one thing that is needed.

Pray: Present Lord, the world is a noisy place vying for our constant attention. There is so much to do. We know our work will never be complete, yet we work at it feverishly. Still us in your presence. Quiet our minds and hearts. Let us rest before you and listen to your voice for you are the better part. Amen
