
VOICE OF EMMANUEL SEEDS OF HOPE!



^{9b}If you remove the yoke from among you, the pointing of the finger, the speaking of evil,

¹⁰if you offer your food to the hungry and satisfy the needs of the afflicted, then your light shall rise in the darkness and your gloom be like the noonday.

Faith5 Corner: by Pastor Mike Tenth Sunday after Pentecost

Share: Share your highs and lows

Read: Isaiah 58:9b-14

Talk: Slowly reflect on the reading. Did anything grab your attention as you read the passage? Have you ever done something nice for someone and felt like you received a blessing? Often when we reach out beyond ourselves to offer love and compassion in real and concrete ways, we begin to feel something stir within us, that the Holy Spirit is active and alive.

When you read through this passage do you read it as prescriptive or descriptive? We often tend to read it as prescriptive, that the Lord will do good things to us or give us good things only when we do good things to others. Or that if we don't do good things, God will continue to keep us in the dark, parched, and weak boned. But is that how God works? Is that really what this texts says?

When you allow God to work in and through you, isn't there refreshment in that? Don't you feel renewed. The words of Isaiah describe what it means to live in the Lord. When we recognize what God is doing in our lives we are free to share that grace with others, and in doing so we, too, are blessed.

Pray: Righteous Lord, too often we place ourselves on the throne of your kingdom, judging who is in and who is out, determining the value and fate of those around us. Yet, you call us out and set us on another path. Restore us by your mercy that we, too, can find our place among the forgiven and redeemed. Amen
