VOICE OF EMMANUEL SEEDS OF HOPE!

Highlights of October 10, 2023 Congregation Council meeting:

- For the month of September 2023, expenses exceeded offerings by \$11,299. For the year-to-date, expenses exceed offerings by \$8,420.
- In-Person Attendance at our Sunday worship services in September averaged 77. This was five more than September of 2022 (72). Our number of views on-line through Facebook in September averaged 167 an increase of 39 from 2022 (128). For the year-to-date we have averaged 82 people at in-person worship each Sunday. This is an increase of 15 from 2022 (67). Our number of Facebook views year to date averaged 138 an increase of 40 views from 2022 (98).
- The 2024 Proposed Ministry Spending Plan (budget) has been approved by the Council in the amount of \$321,728. The Congregation will vote on the Proposed Ministry Spending Plan at the November 12, 2023 Congregational Meeting immediately before the 10 am worship service. The Plan will be published in the Newsletter and copies will be available in the North Wing prior to the meeting.
- Emmanuel has three special offerings each year; one at Thanksgiving, one at Christmas and one at Easter. In addition to their regular offering, the congregation is given the opportunity to contribute to these special offerings through Emmanuel. The Council has designated the Thanksgiving special offering for the Lincoln County Coalition Against Domestic Violence better known as Amy's House/ Amy's Closet. The Christmas offering has been designated for Christian Ministry of Lincoln County.
- The Church has stackable upholstered chairs that we plan to discard. These are quality chairs but the fabric is ripped from wear and the chairs are no longer needed. These would be nice chairs if the seat and back were reupholstered. They are looking for a new and caring home and will be available in the north wing free of charge.
- The Property Committee is exploring dusk to dawn LED lights on the Faith Building that would shine in the playground (back of building) and patio (side of building). These are needed for safety reasons.
- The Stewardship Committee will begin the 2024 stewardship appeal on November 5th with a temple talk. Commitment cards with a brochure outlining the 2024 Ministry Initiatives of the church will be mailed soon. The theme of the appeal is "Continuing Our Journey Together". Please give prayerful thought to your commitment and to your giving in 2024. Increasing costs are affecting our programs and ministries of the church.
- Emmanuel through the Outreach Committee was able to buy 24 students each a book at Battleground Elementary School. Battleground had their Annual Book Fair and these were students that could not afford to purchase a book.




