#### Highlights of December 12, 2023 Congregation Council meeting:

- \* For the month of November 2023, offerings exceeded expenses by \$9,011. For the year-to-date, offerings exceed expenses by \$18,118.
- \* A row of large Leyland Cypress trees between the playground and alleyway were removed by the City of Lincolnton. The property committee had given the City permission to remove them. They were obstructing the electrical transmission lines and also encroaching on the playground. A street light in the alleyway was also fixed by the City of Lincolnton so as to illuminate the playground area better at night.
- \* The Stewardship Campaign has been a great success. 58 families and individuals made commitments totaling \$247,664. This represents 78% of our 2024 spending plan needs. Many increased their commitments from the year before. Some made their first-time commitments. If you have not turned in your commitment you may still mail it, bring by the church office or place in the offering plate at worship. Your generosity is greatly needed and greatly appreciated.
- \* We need all "hands on deck" for this Saturday, December 16 at 9:00 am to clean the sanctuary, north wing and fellowship hall. These areas need a good cleaning due to lots of use. With enough people we can be finished in an hour. It will be nice to have a clean church for Christmas.
- \* The Council approved the Young Professionals Steering Committee using our parking area for vendors for the Apple Drop on New Years Eve. The Apple Drop is a family-oriented event in uptown sponsored by the City of Lincolnton.
- \* Steve Lounsbury, Ruth Murphy and Ben Robinson were honored with a certificate and a "Faithful Servant" ink pen for their four years of serving on Congregation Council.
- \* Emmanuel's Annual Congregational meeting was scheduled for Sunday, February 25, 2024. It will be immediately before worship. Yearbooks will be distributed on that day and members of the Nominating Committee will be elected. Reports to be included in the Yearbook are due by January 15, 2024.



Paul presents benchmarks for faithful relationships with Christians and non-Christians. Love is the unflagging standard of our behavior. When we encounter evil, we do not resort to its tactics but seek to overcome it with good. While Christians cannot control the actions and attitudes of others, we seek to live at peace with all people.

<sup>9</sup>Let love be genuine; hate what is evil, hold fast to what is good; <sup>10</sup>love one another with mutual affection; outdo one another in showing honor. <sup>11</sup>Do not lag in zeal, be ardent in spirit, serve the Lord. <sup>12</sup>Rejoice in hope, be patient in suffering, persevere in prayer. <sup>13</sup>Contribute to the needs of the saints; extend hospitality to strangers.

<sup>14</sup>Bless those who persecute you; bless and do not curse them. <sup>15</sup>Rejoice with those who rejoice, weep with those who weep. <sup>16</sup>Live in harmony with one another; do not be haughty, but associate with the lowly; do not claim to be wiser than you are. <sup>17</sup>Do not repay anyone evil for evil, but take thought for what is noble in the sight of all. <sup>18</sup>If it is possible, so far as it depends on you, live peaceably with all. <sup>19</sup>Beloved, never avenge yourselves, but leave room for the wrath of God; for it is written, "Vengeance is mine, I will repay, says the Lord." <sup>20</sup>No, "if your enemies are hungry, feed them; if they are thirsty, give them something to drink; for by doing this you will heap burning coals on their heads." <sup>21</sup>Do not be overcome by evil, but overcome evil with good.

**Read:** Romans 12:9-21

**Talk**: Slowly reflect on the reading. Paul pretty much summarizes how

Jesus taught us to live and treat others. I counted twenty-four different instructions. Twenty-four instructions each worthy of a sermon or a Sunday school class. (Or, if you like twenty-four post -its.) Read the text again. Ask yourself the following: Which of these do I like the best? Which of these do I have trouble understanding? Which of these do I find hard to follow in my everyday life? And why do I find some of them hard to follow? None of us are perfect. We all have something we need to "work" on. Do you think Paul's instructions can help us figure out what

we are good at and where we need to improve?

**Pray**: Thank you Jesus for teaching us how to live our lives. Thank you,

God for giving us scripture which we can turn to for guidance. Thank you for forgiving us when we stray from your teachings. Help to live the way Jesus, your Son, taught us to live. Amen
